From Fr. Tom Fitzpatick:

It is the Fifth Sunday of Lent already, and before we know it Holy Week will be upon us. Next week is Palm Sunday! We are entering the homestretch of Lent, when we continue to embrace and endure the disciplines we have undertaken or to get going with our prayer, fasting and almsgiving. We are kind of in the same place as students who have tests coming in a few weeks; they really have to delve into the remote preparations for exams by reading, underlining and taking notes, etc. We are almost there, but not yet. There is plenty of Lent left.

The within the context of our first reading from the Book of the Prophet Jeremiah is a yet another demonstration of promise and fulfillment. As our faith teaches us, the fulfillment always and only comes through the Person of Christ. At the same time, this particular instance of promise and fulfillment has another component that is constant in our life in Christ: what we call the "already, but not yet".

The promise the Lord made through Jeremiah to literally write His love and law on their hearts must have sounded rather far-flung to the Israelites at the time. One constant in their struggles to know God and trust in His care and Providence is the fact that everything seemed to take so long as we toil in difficulty. To them, as evidenced by the witness of Scripture, inaction meant sluggishness on the part of God to rush to their aid when difficulties arose and obstacles hindered their freedom and relief from enemies. Even worse, it led to distrust, then a falling back on their old ways.

We labor under the same burden too. The "already but not yet" of the Kingdom of God means that the promise God made through Jeremiah looks past even the reconciliation of the People of God through the Passion of Christ: what we are talking about here is the New Heaven and New Earth promised by Christ when He comes again. It is an example of how all the promises of Christ and the actions of God are "hidden" in the Old Testament.

While Christ is already present in His Church, and the Kingdom of God reigns for those who seek its reality, the fact is that "This reign is still under attack by the evil powers even though they have

been defeated definitively by Christ's Passover" (CCC #751). The New Heaven and New Earth will be formed when Christ comes again, as we know. We also know this is the one prophecy yet to be fulfilled in its entirety. So the "already" is the victory of Christ and our recourse to His grace and charity. We are encouraged to share the spoils of His victory over sin and death through faith in Him, confident that the "not yet" is just a matter of time.

So between this rock and hard place we seek to live as children of the light, following the age-old ways of God. Faith is the counter-balance to our sometime faulty demands for immediate action from God, as the Israelites mistakenly sought. They forgot, and constantly needed to be reminded that "inaction" from God never meant He was not present to them, or in their midst. His patience with their shenanigans and providential care was always an encouragement to willfully trust Him in faith

Thus we find ourselves in the last weeks of Lent, sacrificing and seeking, and maybe wondering what good it all does. This is where our faith assures us what we really know. We must press on, because we want to be ready for the coming of Christ in the "not yet" of His Second Coming, and the "already" by His victory at Easter.

Runners drag themselves out in all types of bleak and inclement weather far in advance of race day because they know intuitively the tough days are the ones that pay off when race time comes. We are in the same boat...we continue to slog on, knowing that Lenten preparation helps us to enter more deeply into the mystery of our Salvation come the next few weeks. Lenten rigor leads joy, and the grace of God we desire and need to thrive in already, but not yet of the Kingdom of God.

Remember! Grace is the light that helps us see our way home from the darkened world in which we live. This same light led the Israelite through the desert. We are called to be children of the light for precisely this reason. The forces of evil took Jesus in the dark of the night even though He preached openly in the daylight before them. As God's creatures called to be children of light, we continue on this Lenten march to Calvary with Christ, the light of the world. This is so we may live always in the light of His Resurrection, judged by the one and only Just Judge.




