From Fr. Tom Fitzpatick:

"This is the day that the Lord has made, let us rejoice and be glad". Christ has triumphed over death, and His victory is ours as well. Our Lord teaches us that suffering for the sake of virtue and holiness does have a reward: a reward that far outstrips any worldly prize. He has opened for us all the gates of heaven, and beckons us to our true home. This is the reason that we can suffer joyfully and endure disciplines for the sake of rectitude and Truth that sees past the trappings of this world. Our life in virtue and charity is the key.

Our Lord demonstrates that true freedom is the happy consequence of love. It is evident in the love He showed us by bearing the weight of humanity's sin and estrangement from God by His suffering and death. He taught us a New, and powerful Commandment: to love one and other as He has loved us. He loved those He wasn't supposed to love, and ignored the conventions and the prejudices of His time through love. Love is beneficial to both the one who gives love, and receives love.

The Lord has also given us the most genuine way to love ourselves. Our attention is turned from the trappings of the world and its false aggrandizements, and is instead turned towards the eternal and the things of God. We love ourselves through Him, His presence in our souls, and the beautiful share in His creative power He bestows upon us: the ability to give and beget love in freedom. These are the fruits of grace, and this grace was won by His victory on the Cross.

The Good News is not too good to be true. We have at our disposal the power of the Cross, the witness of Scripture, the beauty of theology, and most importantly, the knowledge of God's loving call that our soul knows by His gifts of grace. Despite the distractions and pressures of our daily life, we are able to live holiness and devotion despite our stumbling and transgressions. While we may struggle, remember the nobility of our pursuit, and the sublime nature of our call to live as children of the light.

We were purchased at great price by the blood and sacrifice of Son of God. That ought to tell us something about the love God has for us, and our value to Him because of this love. What cause for joy and trust in the Lord! It teaches us that whatever our past, our future is determined by our response to His call to love Him above all things.

As we progress through this Easter season, we put the 40 days of penance behind us. The Easter season is fifty days; a period of joy that compares most favorably to the forty days of prayer and penance we have just observed. Christ exemplifies the love of God. It is not punitive or coercive. Rather, His love is one that beckons and teaches by appealing to our very nature itself, a nature that gravitates toward the Good inherently by His grace working with the natural inclinations written on our hearts. The final act of God to reorder our sinful nature ties together the Covenants of old by the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Christ. Ransomed by the price of His Blood, our emancipation is ensured by our Gospel life, and by partaking in His Sacraments.

So, we must live as the redeemed children we are, putting into practice the freedom that Christ bestows on us by being called sons and daughters of God. Let us practice virtue and goodness because we can...not just because it is something we are supposed to do.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd: CGS Catechists Needed: "Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS) is a Catholic religious education program for 3-12 year old children. CGS uses hands-on materials to assist the child in knowledge of liturgy and scripture. Children meet weekly in a specially prepared environment called an atrium. In the atrium adult catechists present materials to children, either individually or in a small group allowing them to work with and meditate on scripture, liturgy and the life of the church. They learn through relationship, prayer, and discussion. Because the children are able to return to the work as often as they choose which is immersed in scripture, it becomes a form of Lectio Divina or contemplative prayer for them." We want to bring CGS back to STM, but we need people to get trained to help with this.
